SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members of the Legislature, I think we could make short work of this. I would ask Senator Janssen, he has indicated that on this particular bill would be agreeable to him, I think, to adopt this amendment, and then for the commission to come back in with a more narrowly drawn version of what they're interested in, kind of reversing the process on the last bill, to a certain extent. So I would yield my time to Senator Janssen to verify that. And, if that's the case, then we can move ahead.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Janssen, you have four and a half minutes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, it certainly won't take me that long, Mr. Lieutenant Governor. Members of the body, yes, I believe that we can turn the tables back around this time, and go ahead and pass the Chambers amendment, which takes out this section, and come back and, on Select File, and see if there's anything that the commission feels as though absolutely has to be in there and explains it in the fashion that we can...we can adopt amendment to that. If not, we'll leave it the way it is. We've been...they have been operating under this for a good many years now, and I don't see why it could...it would hurt anything if it stayed the same. We'll fine tune it a little bit. Thank you very much, Senator Chambers, for your help on this, Senator Beutler and Senator Schimek. And I hope you will find it favorable to pass the amendment and the bill. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Janssen. For discussion on the Chambers amendment, Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: I will use almost no time. I was just going to support the amendment; I think it makes sense. I think they can weed out the frivolous complaints under the first section that's left in the bill. And that's all I have to say. Thank you.
