One of the ideas that, I think it was Senator Beutler came up with, well, if you want to put in something new in a department, then you ask that agency what they'll trade. That won't work because you have ongoing programs that are backed and probably started because of federal programs, and that federal money sits there. You have to use it one way or another, you can't just arbitrarily stop a program, it's not that simple. I wish we could. I guess what I wish...what all of us would like was that we could be able just to stop state government for a day and start all over, start from square one. Well, there again, the world doesn't work that way. But I'll go back to the A bills. And I've been on...this is my ninth year on Appropriations. I've been there, in Room 1003, fairly often several years ago, till two o'clock in the morning, trying to figure out what priorities we needed to fund to keep certain agencies, University of Nebraska, all the colleges, health and human services that we are obligated to give to people who need them. And, if you look at the pie once more, I like that pie because it shows where the money goes and where it comes from, and when you see where it goes, you understand again that there are certain programs, all the programs we fund, most of them, we can't stop doing it. I have three bills. I want more money for Domestic Violence Coalition; I want more money for the people who are in nursing homes, to up their allowance, their monthly allowance, the ones who are nursing homes and some disabled who are on Medicaid; and I want more money for libraries. Am I going to sacrifice those today? I don't know if I'm going to or not. I voted for this to come out of committee because I thought it needed to be talked about. You notice that Senator Lynch isn't here; he voted against it. He thinks it's a feel-good thing, and I hope Dan will forgive me for quoting him, but in a way he's right, that we're trying to bring something to the floor this morning so all of us understand, when we get to that last day and vote for the budget and send it to the Governor, that what we have in there are the things that we think are priorities, the things that we think we need to fund. And Senator Wehrbein mentioned the buildings, we have been working I don't know how many years now, the 309 Committee has really done a tremendous job bringing to us the real needs of those buildings that have been let go for so many years.
