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services. And, of course, in Nebraska, that burden is made much worse because, of course, we know that women only earn about 71 percent of what men earn in Nebraska. We have talked about Viagra a little bit, and I was tending toward maybe talking about the specifics of Viagra much more than I am actually going to this morning. But when Viagra came out, less than two months later, more than half of those prescriptions were being subsidized by health plans. Now if we can pay for the usage of Viagra, I think that we can also pay to ensure that women are able to avoid pregnancy as well. I would also remind those senators who might be tempted to vote on this particular issue based upon their religious affiliation that there's been a discussion about the death penalty over the last couple of months and one particular religious affiliation has indicated pretty strongly that the death penalty is immoral. And so I would ask you to remember that when you vote on this particular issue. Thank you.

**SPEAKER KRISTENSEN:** Senator Chambers.

**SENATOR CHAMBERS:** Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, whenever I have the opportunity to have my education improved, I make the most of it, and some of my colleagues have, indeed, improved my education this morning. Now maybe Senator Bohlke is quite sanguine because she got a chairmanship, but, Senator Bohlke, I've had other females in this Legislature come to me about the way they were being treated, and I was on the Executive Board when I saw women bounced off committees on which they had served, Senator Landis, and had served very well. They had done excellent work, and we traditionally put people back on committees which they've been on. See, that's where institutional memory is good, and I will talk about it. Others want to give the impression that every thing is nice around here. Senator Crosby was treated so nice by David so every thing is all right with her. That's not me, brothers and sisters. I've had bills advanced from committees. That doesn't blind me to what goes on. I have bills pending in committees. You think because I want to get a bill out of committee I'm going to pretend that problems I see I will not discuss. I see my other colleagues afraid to take a position because there is something they want to get from the other senators or another committee, that's not me. You won't see me sniveling around
