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The kids want me to talk to them, why do they want me to talk to them? Why don't they ask some of the 48 of you, and maybe they do ask for some of you. But from now on, I will just tell them, ask one of these other senators. But if they ask me to talk to them, young people are my heart, and I might have a little space for some of these old people. But old people have had the opportunity to live their life. They have blundered and made the world a mess that young people have to try to straighten out. Then when we are given another opportunity for a smidgen of redemption, we listen to what the insurance companies tell us, and we say, well, women are not maltreated, women get more individual coverage under this policy than a man does, and we, again, start itemizing these things. Doctors and everybody in this society knows the significance physically and psychologically of a woman's breasts, and male doctors were unnecessarily removing women's breasts. Now that more females have become doctors, there are far fewer of those types of operations, and I'm going to be told on this floor that if four women were on the Banking Committee, the decision would have been the same? That's like saying human nature doesn't change. And you know what the person who says that means? Human nature is like what people in my hometown would do? And whatever people in my hometown would do is what everybody would do. So if I'm a woman and I'd vote against this, then if you had four of us on there, they would all vote the way I vote. See, I know the difference, as a black man, between an Uncle Tom and a race man, between an Aunt Jemima and a race woman. Not every woman is going to kowtow like some women say they themselves would do, and there are divisions among women. But it's not because they don't realize the seriousness of the issue and that something ought to be done, they want to hold on to what little they've got and they don't want to risk it. They'll win something in the short run, but in the long run, they will lose, and they make it harder for these young women. They are going to have to fight the same battle because those who could cut the trail now refuse to do it. There is an obligation and a responsibility that we have. We do have the obligation, even if we didn't create...
