I think what we're doing is better than the present system and I think we can make it better, and this is the first step. So, therefore, Senator Bromm, I do oppose your bracket and would like to move on with this issue today.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I have taken an approach this morning, based on what I had said yesterday, that the Legislature is to be a teacher for the public and sometimes we help each other. The approach that I often take is by questioning my colleagues, because people not only pay more attention but it helps focus the issues and you give the other side a chance to react to you while you're making your comments. I could not question myself, well, actually, I could, but I...it wouldn't be as feasible for me to question myself on these issues as it was for Senator Schimek to question me. And I wanted to keep talking about the constitution, the constitution, to get somebody to read what is there, and then ask me, how does what you square...how does what you say square with what is written in the constitution now or what will be written there if 14CA is adopted in its present form. And I did give a hint, as I pointed out, by saying they would have to both be of the same political party, then I said "maybe", and the transcript will bear that out. We do need to take these matters very seriously, discuss them in all of their implications, and I would not have left as the final word a position that I had taken which could be interpreted as being deceptive. I expect to be questioned on the things that I say and I think it's helpful when I or any other senator is questioned. I tell young people when I talk to them, that should be their watch word--question, question, question. Question everybody. Question everything. And when we come to the constitution, questions are merited and they should be asked, and I invite those questions. Now, back to what we're doing here with 14CA. I do not believe that a person should be limited to individuals who have gone through the step of registering with a particular political party. That should not be like abracadabra, where something magical is supposed to have taken place. All you do to register to vote is to go down to one of these places and tell them I want to register with this party, and that's
