SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers, your light is next.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, this is the point that I'm getting to, this resolution, very self-righteous, very misleading. The only thing that ought to be said in this resolution, if one is to be sent, strip all these whereases out, except that whereas, Nebraska is a state; whereas, there are 50 states in the Union; whereas, on whatever the date is, Nebraska joined the Union; whereas, a settlement is going to be made that's going to produce a lot of money in which the states can participate, Nebraska being a state desirous to participate, and leave all this other stuff alone. I'd like to ask Senator Jensen a question.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Jensen, will you yield once more?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Jensen, if this resolution is not passed, Nebraska will still be in the same position as it is now, isn't that true?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: This resolution doesn't strengthen Nebraska's position or entitle Nebraska to any more money, does it?

SENATOR JENSEN: No, all it does is make a statement to our representatives in Washington and to the President that we would like them to, as Senator Wehrbein said, keep their hands off.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, how many representatives does Nebraska have who are not "Repelicans"? One, isn't that right? Isn't Senator Kerrey the only "non-Repelican" who represents Nebraska in Washington?

SENATOR JENSEN: That is true.
