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have any. I think it may have some impact. This resolution is one of many throughout other states...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, if...

SENATOR JENSEN: ...going to the representatives.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: We know it's not going to have, I say it will have no impact on the President at all. Do you think your representatives from this state have to be told by the Legislature to try to tell the government don't put its hands on this money? Do they have to be told...

SENATOR JENSEN: Doesn't hurt to...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...that by the Legislature?

SENATOR JENSEN: It does not hurt to remind them.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you think...

SENATOR JENSEN: And I, too, have sent personal letters, or will send personal letters to those representatives, asking them to support this measure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you think, if we don't send this resolution, they're not going to support the position advocated by the resolution?

SENATOR JENSEN: I think this would certainly help in their decision-making process.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, let me ask the question a different way. If they're of a mind not to support what the Legislature is asking them to support, do you think receipt of this resolution would change their mind, and they would now support it because we told them to?

SENATOR JENSEN: It's...they receive letters, just like we all do, from constituents.

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.
