SENATOR JENSEN: I think...I think they'd be receptive of a letter coming from the Nebraska Legislature endorsing this, I certainly do, this resolution.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Have you, Senator Jensen, talked to any of the representatives, the House members and the Senate member from Nebraska about this?

SENATOR JENSEN: I have talked, yes, with the congressional representative of the Second District.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Does he agree with you on this?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So, why do we do this?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, I...it...it's...it's symbolic. But it certainly, I think, lets them know what the state wishes are.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It's symbolic? Yesterday, I was talking about something that was symbolic, and I got my teeth kicked in by the Legislature. So why do you want this symbolic act to be voted up by the Legislature?

SENATOR CROSBY: Time. Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Jensen, a couple more questions, if I may.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Jensen, will you yield once more?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: And I'm very much in support of this resolution. But I'm trying to ascertain what our reasonable expectations might be. For example, as I understand how this would work with regard to one aspect, the federal government and the state government currently has...both currently have cigarette taxes, right?
