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resolution, is true, do we?

SENATOR JENSEN: The expenses that the state has borne to this time certainly have come from this state. And...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What...

SENATOR JENSEN: Pardon? And...and there was not any assistance from the federal government in that particular case.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: When the term "the litigation" is used, what litigation is being referred to? Is it litigation filed in a state court in Nebraska?

SENATOR JENSEN: I really cannot say whether it's state or federal.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then let's go back to page 501, to the second "Whereas". And this is what it says, "Whereas, the state lawsuit was brought for violation of state law under state law theories, and the state lawsuit did not make any federal claims". If it was brought in state court and made no federal claims, it's obvious that it was not brought in federal court, it was brought in state court. Which state court was it brought in?

SENATOR JENSEN: Senator Chambers, I'm not sure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would you be willing, Senator Jensen, to lay this over and we strip out some of these unnecessary whereases and get right down to the nub of what it is, because...and that's all I will ask...I mean, I will ask you that question first. Would you be willing to do that?

SENATOR JENSEN: If I could have a date, yes. But, yes, I would be willing to do that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I will promise you that I will work with you. I'm not opposed to what is being attempted. But I think, when too much is said and too much is argued, somebody is trying to get credit, not you, for having done something which was not done by the state of Nebraska. So let me ask you a couple of
