SENATOR CROSBY: About three minutes, three and a half minutes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I think we can do...okay, let my time be running.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Chambers, you still have a cou...three minutes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, I withdraw that motion.

SENATOR CROSBY: No objections? It is withdrawn. Senator Jensen.

SENATOR JENSEN: Madam President, I would ask that we would pass over LR 29 at this time.

SENATOR CROSBY: No objections? It is passed over. Thank you, Senator Jensen and Senator Chambers. Mr. Clerk. (LB) 211.

CLERK: Madam President, thank you. LB 211, the bill has been discussed on Select File. Enrollment and Review amendments were adopted on February 23. Senator Beutler had an amendment to the bill adopted. Senator Bohlke had moved to bracket the bill, which prevailed. I do have an amendment pending, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Schmitt, would...I'll give you a couple of minutes to bring us up to date where we stand on this bill.

SENATOR SCHMITT: Well, it's been a while back, but I believe, when we finished with the bill prior, it had been brought back to the original, to where it just left the State Capitol as the only building that would be smoke-free. The Tyson amendment had been taken off, and so we were back to the original bill.
