we approached it, not with the spirit of limiting freedom, but of a spirit of accommodating differences in people. That to me is the appropriate standard we should take here.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Landis. Continued discussion on the Preister amendment, Senator Schmitt.

SENATOR SCHMITT: Yes, Madam President. I rise to support the Preister amendment. I think Senator Preister has worked hard on this. I think he has met with a lot of people. And I understand very clearly that when we're working on issues we don't talk to everybody here in the body. But the ones that had the basic concerns, the veterans home, the fairgrounds, the university, the Game and Parks, I think have all been addressed in this. And I think it's fairly clear as to what it does. I think most departments right now with vehicles don't allow smoking in those vehicles; some do, if the people that are driving them are alone, but most of them do not now. So I just want to rise and support Senator Preister's amendment onto 211. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Schmitt. Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes, thank you, Madam Chairman and members. I kind of agree with Senator Landis. I think it's...it's another area where we're trying to mandate some things, and it probably wasn't handled the best way, but those things happen. But I basically just want to address the Section 5 that pertains to the State Fair Park, and that this is something that they can live with. It would have affected them very...put a great hardship on them the other way, and so this will help. And they can live with this. And so, with that, I would support the amendment. But I also can know...I also know where Senator Landis is coming from, because it's another mandate that we're putting onto people of this state. So thank you.
