advertising that they would not otherwise prohibit under the Interstate Commerce Act?

SENATOR JENSEN: I am not aware of that, but that's a question I cannot answer at this time. Sure would be glad to look into that further.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Part of the material that your staff was kind enough to give me talked about a state enforcement fund and the fact that there would be \$50 million going to the states to help enforce and implement the agreement and to investigate and litigate potential conflicts. Is that \$50 million being divided up and actually given, allocated to each state or do you apply to some federal fund or something? What...the bottom line to my question is this, do we need to establish some kind of cash fund to take in this money and then to appropriate it out? I don't like these situations where settlement monies are just hanging around sort of, and I didn't see in the bill where there was any provision for any cash fund for the taking in of these monies.

SENATOR JENSEN: I don't believe that we need a special task force on it, or to look at these dollars. I do recall in the bill that there is \$50 million to look at that. I kind of thought that that might be as an as needed request that you could get these dollars. But, again, I'll dig into that a little...little further to determine if they are going to prorate it, as they did the settlement, itself.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah.

SENATOR JENSEN: Or if...but it was my thought that these were dollars that were to be as needed if there was a situation that came up.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Like you were applying for a grant or something with some holder of the funds.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes, yes, but I certainly will check into that.
