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SENATOR BROWN: ...can be managed?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: There are some, but they are supposed to come up with some new rules and regs under this with the committee amendments.

SENATOR BROWN: Okay, thank you. I will be following Senator Landis' lead in voting against the committee amendment because I agree that it...that it seems like we have tried to concede too much, and some things, like the whole part about the State Patrol, I am not even sure we understand what the implications may be. But I also wondered if I might pose a couple of questions to Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers, would you yield?

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Chambers, would you yield?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I will.

SENATOR BROWN: Thank you. Senator, do you...do you feel that alcohol and consumption of alcohol by young people is dangerous to them.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I think consumption by anybody...of alcohol by anybody is dangerous.

SENATOR BROWN: Then how do we, from a policy standpoint, hold young people responsible for that action and try to protect them?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, that's too broad a question for me to answer, and I am not trying to be facetious. But I really think that education, setting an example would be the things to do, and not have parents giving their children alcohol pursuant to the law in the home, but if they give it to them in the park, then it's a crime.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR BROWN: What about...
