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after that is...can't be prosecuted because it's not under the guidelines. Isn't that correct?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: That's...that's right.

SENATOR BEUTLER: So the word that's going to go around in the retail community is simply, you can protect yourself by asking one question first, just verbally ask if they're under 21.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: I think the concern right now is that they don't do that.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, I'm just...it just seems to me that if I'm thinking of this correctly it's an obvious and open way to avoid the whole procedure because you're invalidating the procedure if you orally lie and say that you're not under 21. Do you see what I mean?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: I see where you're coming from. We may have to look at that issue.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Less than a minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. The...on page 7 of the bill, the committee amendment on line 3 seems to...seems to retain the "may", "may order", and this is the provision that has to do with the alternative of suspending...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Line 3, page 7, Senator.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: On line 3?
