SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Probably...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Just a...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: ...I think you're probably right, it probably should be "shall order" on the third offense.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. And then the last question I had, just to get the thoughts of the committee, I don't...not the thoughts of the committee, just to educate me, I guess, down on the bottom of page 6, under the old language of the bill, the penalties ran \$50 per day.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Right.

SENATOR BEUTLER: How does that actually work? I mean, if you have a sting operation and they make...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: If they...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...a mistake and sell...sell the liquor...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: If they come in...

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...to an underage person,...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yeah.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...is that a one-day violation?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: No, most generally they give them from five to ten days, and so...

SENATOR BEUTLER: How are they able to do that?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: It's according to how many they've had before and it's...there's no set fine. It's if their second offense or third offense, you know, they'll increase the amount of the actual days, but most generally they give them five days so it's \$250 currently.

SENATOR BEUTLER: So even though the sting is one event at one
