years. We've always said, well, we're going to take another look at it. We're trying, with this amendment that Senator Chambers wants to strike, to come in with a top class sting operation that is run not just by the State Patrol but just in conjunction with them so they draw up the guidelines and under their...their control somewhat, and they keep track of all these here stings. I think it's a good step forward. And this body also has to realize that we have to keep these two entities as one bill. We can't just pick on the retailer. We can't just pick on the minors we've done in these past years. We need to keep them together if we're going to get anything passed that's going to help to keep alcohol away from the teenagers. This bill and these amendments will help, but I don't want...if you take away the...to make the sting to go back like we currently have, we're not taking away that there sting 'cause that sting's still going to be there, it's going to be done in unfair practice. It's going to be unfair to the retailers, 'cause that was the main concern we've had in the past years with legislation proposing to do something on just the retailers. It was always something done that was...they think was unfair. This is something I think that everyone can live with. So I would oppose the Chambers amendment. The other two amendments that Senator Chambers had, he thinks they're important but, basically, what they did, they allow the law enforcement to charge the teenagers easier.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: One minute.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: If that's what he wants to do, which he has already done it, but it allows them to be charged easier than what they were under the bill. So it's...I think if he wants to help teenagers, the other two amendments went just the opposite way, but that's what he wanted to do so that's what we did. But I would oppose this amendment at this time. Thank you.
