SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: They do, but not under...under stings they don't. We're talking about stings here.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, you could set up a sting in different manners, couldn't you?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: They don't use false IDs under stings.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Couldn't they use false IDs?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: They don't. It's against the law. They don't use false IDs, Senator.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, that may be the fact then. I'm not aware that they don't do that.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: They don't use false IDs in stings.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: So I...to me, you're trying to say that we should be using false IDs, and I don't think we want to go down that path.

SENATOR BEUTLER: No, I'm not saying you should use false IDs. I'm just saying, as far...I'd be interested in what law precludes the use of a false ID. But if there is such a law, then the problem doesn't exist.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: When we passed...

SENATOR BEUTLER: But if you're...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: When we passed the sting operation several years ago, that said they shall use the...or that they can't use false IDs in there. So I don't think, you know, you're saying now...so all we're saying here is that you shall provide truthful identification.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yeah. If there is a law that says that you cannot use false IDs in a sting operation, then my point is not
