SENATOR JANSSEN: No, he had...the only thing I know of, he had a...his qualification where he had 23 years of experience with the city of Omaha in their Police Division, organization skills, (inaudible) making, so on, so forth like that and...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, Senator Janssen, pardon me, what does his activities with the police have to do with what we're talking about here?

SENATOR JANSSEN: I have...that's in his resume, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, let me ask you, as I read from the Journal, this is what it says above his name. The Government, Military, and Veterans Affairs Committee desires to report favorably upon the appointment listed below. The committee suggests the appointment be confirmed by the Legislature and suggests a record vote.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So when this said "record vote," that didn't refer to his record as a boxer.

SENATOR JANSSEN: No, no, no, but I can tell you a little bit more about his...he's been in the boxing...involved with boxing for 25 years. He's been...he trained and managed amateur and professional boxers. He's a chartered member of the Omaha Amateur Boxing Coaches Association, amateur and professional judge, owned and operated the Ringside Gym in Omaha, trained numerous city and district champions, trained one national champion, appoint...he was appointed to the Athletic Commission in 1994 and appointed the chief inspector of the last...Athletic Commission in February of 1995. Those are some of his qualifications, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And, Senator Janssen, I'm glad that that is now in the record because we see that this man is eminently qualified for the position that he is being nominated for, and I will make my disclaimer at this point.
