I guess I was caught in a weak moment in my zeal for wanting to support the respite care, because I understand the need for that, although I will tell you that it is not automatically going to be an endorsement to move forward. But I do believe we ought to maintain the integrity of this trust fund. In fact, I strongly, strongly believe we ought to maintain the integrity of this trust fund, not only because that's what it was set for and we had...we had the trust fund in place for what we anticipated would happen. I think that is...we ought not to undo that intent this soon already. The second thing is that I believe that we...you will have no rationale at all to reduce the run on this yet this session if we were to allow this to start happening now. As Senator Jensen's passed out, many of...many of these ahead of us are...in his list, are certainly eligible for that. And it's probably, I...in order to be up front and fair about this in this debate, I will tell you we're going to be under extreme challenges come May to fit all the spending in that is being talked about, has been talked about. I've tried to make light of it in a sense over the last few weeks, but we truly are headed for major Governor vetoes if we do not try to pull our spending in line somewhat ourselves. And the reason I say this is because we're going to have difficulty with our budget. The preliminary budget that we brought forward to you a week ago that's in your yellow sheet, look at that and see what's available, the handout that I handed out day before yesterday, to see what's available. And even if the Governor's Tax Relief Fund doesn't go and even if we don't do some other things and even assuming what we did yesterday will go, it's not a major blip in that. But you add up all the spending bills that are coming out of the various committees, not only the millions but the hundreds of thousands, and then we are finding weekly, if not daily, in our committee of some serious imbalances, I guess you would say, that we are finding between agencies in some of ours...in some of the areas that we're covering, having to do with salaries in some cases, in (laugh) actually in many cases, things that are not being discovered that are basic hard-core, if you will, state government responsibilities. And so those are the kinds of issues we're going to have to balance off as we start in to new programs, or at least potentially new programs. Do we keep faith with decisions that we have made, not only
