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fly ball or what, but state your point.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The point is that there's only been, I think, one speaker this time around against the proposition and only two speakers altogether, so I would just ask the Chair for a ruling on time.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Your point's taken. I rule there's not been sufficient debate, Senator Dierks. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Again, this will...

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Dierks, did you wish to object to the ruling?

SENATOR DIERKS: I didn't even hear what the ruling was, Senator Beutler, Senator.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: I ruled that there had not been sufficient debate...

SENATOR DIERKS: Oh.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: ...on both sides.

SENATOR DIERKS: Okay.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Thank you. This is my last comment and I won't take a lot of time. Senator Byars described to you a little bit the experimental nature of this particular program and, again, it flows right back into the Health Care Trust Fund Program...Grant Program. That, as it was conceptualized, as I read it and as I remember it from the debate, was for exactly this kind of thing. And if we're not careful here, I think we're going to...in fact we are going to in fact create additional bureaucracies. Under the green copy of the bill, which is the bill that will pass here, another advisory committee is created with respect to this particular program. And you heard Senator Byars say that part of the advisory committee's duties will be to look and see if different areas of
