SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Sure, go ahead.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...I'm going to turn off my light at this point, and then turn it back on because somebody else may speak.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Further discussion on the Schellpeper amendment, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: After that pause, Senator Crosby, it became clear to me that I'd better turn my light on so that we won't get past this. So while my time is running, I want to read this amendment and see how it fits into the bill. Senator Schellpeper, I would like to ask you a question.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Schellpeper, will you yield?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: As I read this amendment, in line 17, the words "and truthful responses" would be stricken, is that correct?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: You have to also strike "to inquiries" and then add "upon request" so "truthful identification upon request."

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, now I see what you're doing.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Um-hmm. This came from Senator Beutler, and that's why it's...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: ...(inaudible).

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, Senator Schellpeper, so that we can understand why this provision about these stings is in the bill at all, it was brought to you by the retailers, that is a concern they have?
