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SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Oh, definitely, definitely.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So the State Patrol is not going to be doing that much of it anyway, isn't that true?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: What we're saying here, Senator, is just the guidelines will be set up by...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, no, you're actually saying more than that.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Well, yes, but it's the guidelines set up by these things and, you know, they don't...it just says as, you know, or.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, doesn't the language above that say such compliance checks shall be conducted by, in conjunction with, or under the direction of the Nebraska State Patrol? Are they going to direct these things by remote control or do they have to be involved in the operation?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: No, what...what we're trying to say is that they can set up the guidelines and then they will keep track. We want somebody to keep track of these...these stings.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But that's not what your language says. Your language says...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Well, it does if you go...if you go on down and all the way through it, if you read it, it does.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yeah, I see where you're talking about guidelines, but I'm talking about the active portion of your amendment. It says these are the only circumstances under which these stings can be conducted, based on the language in your amendment.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Um-hmm. Um-hmm.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I am going to go after this amendment to try to...
