CLERK: Senator Chambers has the next amendment to the committee amendments. (See FA48 on page 950 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Clerk, members of the Legislature,...

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Chambers, you're recognized to open on your amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...I want to keep track of where I am. Is that the one I put up this morning to...

CLERK: Yes, sir, page 1, line 15.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. I think I'm going to take it. Senator Schellpeper, I will tell you what this amendment does. On page 1, line 15, starting with "Such" talking about these guidelines, I would strike every thing starting with the word "Such" in line 15 through the period in line 18, and this is the language that would be stricken, and I know that Senator Schellpeper will disagree with it because he made an approach toward modifying this with his amendment. This is the language that would be stricken (sic)...stricken. "Such guidelines shall include, but need not be limited to, requirements that the person provide truthful identification and truthful responses to inquiries and present an appearance which is consistent with the person's chronological age." I don't think that any of this should be in the statute. Let me ask Senator Schellpeper a question or two, since he's basing...

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Schellpeper, will you yield for a question?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schellpeper, you're basing this language on...let me say this, apparently you're basing it on the protocol that the State Patrol uses right now when they conduct these operations. Is that generally true?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: I would like to see it based on that, yes, Senator.
