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SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Definitely.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you think they would require that?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So why would we have to put that in the statute. We really wouldn't, would we?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: No, you're right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, so can you see that this amendment, although I'm against what you're trying to do, is not one that would hurt at all what it is you're trying to do, and really wouldn't even touch it.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yeah, I think you're probably right. It probably wouldn't have to be in here because if we already have guidelines. As long as we have the guidelines, that's my main concern, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right, and you know that even with the adoption of this, I'm going to try to wipe that out.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: I know you would.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But what I would like us to do is pare this language down to the point where we have only what it is you're trying to do without anything that doesn't need to be put in there in order to accomplish your purpose.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: I agree.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So having said that, I'm going to launch into another comment that may be somewhat apart from that amendment because I have to take these opportunities. A person who is a minor, let me ask Senator Schellpeper a question so I'm sure.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Sure.
