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SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schellpeper, I want to find out how many bites from the apple a retailer gets before losing a license and how many bites from the apple the youngster gets before losing his or her license. First of all, if the youngster has any involvement with alcohol, and we're... I am not going to ask you to define this term, what it means, touching and so forth, that can come later. If the young person has the involvement with alcohol that is covered by this bill, how many times does that have to occur before that young person loses the driver's license?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: It'd be on the first time, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: One time. Do we know how many bites of the apple... they say it was an apple, we don't know. Do we know how many bites of the piece of fruit in the Garden of Eden Adam took before God said, curtains, judgment day is over? How many bites?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: That was before my time, that's back in your time, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So you'd have to take my word for it, wouldn't you?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Okay, yeah.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: One, one bite from the apple. Now how many bites from the apple does the drug dealer get before he or she loses a license? Well, the retailer, as you called it.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: I am not... oh, I'm talk...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's all right.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: ...yeah, it would be on the third offense. I'm not...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.
