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his name is Henry Hyde. I call him Jekyll Hyde. Now this man is older than even I, and when this scoundrel had an adulterous affair in his mid-forties, do you know how he characterized it, a youthful indiscretion. He didn't want to call it what it was, which is adultery. That's what it was, Senator Redfield, adultery, but since he's a big shot "Repelican" and leading the attack on Clinton for being a bad actor, which Clinton unquestionably was, is, and always will be, they wanted to clean up the dirty hands of Hyde. Now, Senator Kremer, how in the world are we going to say that a man in his mid-forties, who knowingly and intentionally commits adultery, can call it a youthful indiscretion and say that it ought to be overlooked; then we're going to take these genuinely young people and treat them more harshly than you do this politician. These kids are not even half the age he was when he committed adultery, and his party members clean it up, and say, well, don't call it that. But when it comes to these young people, throw the book at them. You've got retailers out there selling their drug to children and there is more concern with protecting retailers than there is in giving these children a chance. I had four children, my wife and I, four children. I didn't beat my children. I didn't slap my children. I didn't cuff my children. I didn't lay hands on my children in anger, never. My children were always smaller than I am while growing up. They are larger than I am now. There was such a disparity in size that there could not be a justification, based on size, for me to get physical with them. I am older and wiser always, so there was no justification from that standpoint in me losing my temper and using violence on them. My job, as a parent, was to teach them by explaining things and showing them by example how, at least, I thought life ought to be lived. And since I didn't want them picking on children smaller than they, I did not pick on them. And one reason I never used violence on my daughter,...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and I call grabbing violence, I told her when you get old enough to start dealing with a man, you tell that sucker, if he wants to put his hands on you, my father never put his hands on me, and you're not going to do that to me either. That's the way I wanted to rear my daughter. And it wasn't where I'd slap her around and say I'm your father and I
