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can do it. No, my children were not my property. My children did not come into this world by choice, and maybe had they seen the kind of world they were coming into and given a choice, they may have stayed wherever children are before they come here. But I'm not in favor of the approach being taken by this bill and I'm going to do everything I can to rectify it in the way that I think should be done.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Further discussion on the Senator...on the Chambers amendment. Seeing none, Senator Chambers, I'll recognize you to close on your amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I was trying to take some time because I want to continue in my methodology. But let me ask Senator Schellpeper a question about this amendment that's before us.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Schellpeper, will you yield.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schellpeper, will you support this amendment that is before us now.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. So I'm not going to address that amendment because it will be supported, but I'm going to hammer on this issue, not just for today, but because we're going to have other bills coming before us this session that will focus on children in a way that I think is inappropriate. Why don't we set the example for children? And then we can say, do what I do, this is the way you ought to live life, and the proof of it is that I do it myself. But why should they believe you when you tell them, hey, sonny, don't be drinking that liquor. Good God Almighty, look what it does to your daddy. Now do you want to grow up and be like your daddy? Now what you should be able to tell your son is, look at your daddy. Isn't this the way you want to live your life? If you're going to be like somebody, don't you want to be like me? And maybe the child, because there are conflicts that develop between parents and children,
