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with the bank robbers and they have decided what they like in terms of legislation to deal with their illegal activity. They want to be given more leeway in violating the law before certain sanctions are imposed. They want the Legislature or the sheriff to punish the victims, and the ones who ought to be given the most consideration are the perpetrators, and I will not agree to that approach in this bill or any other bills. But I'm going to support Senator Schellpeper's amendment. Do you all realize how much we've carved away from this committee amendment so far and how it has had to be done agonizingly, step by painful step? But the only one who can do it and carry through on it is me.

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Or should I say, Senator Baker, is I, oui. I don't want to seem like I'm trying to be an intellectual by using the proper pronoun in all instances. I'm going to support Senator Schellpeper's amendment and I'm not even going to comment further on that particular one because I have a train coming down the track that can go a long way toward extricating us from what we find ourselves mired in.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Schellpeper, there are no further lights. Would you like to close on your amendment?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Madam Chairman and members, we're just taking out some...some part of the committee amendment that deals with the State Patrol conducting in conjunction or under the direction of the State Patrol, and leaving in that the compliance checks will be conducted to guidelines adopted and promulgated by the State Patrol. I would move for the adoption of the amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Schellpeper. You've heard the closing. The question is the adoption of the Schellpeper amendment to the committee amendments. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. We're voting on the Schellpeper amendment, have you all voted? Record, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Schellpeper's amendment to the committee amendments.
