SENATOR CROSBY: The committee (sic) is adopted.

CLERK: Senator Chambers has...

SENATOR CROSBY: I mean the amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Senator Chambers has the next amendment to the committee amendments, Madam President. (See FA49 on page 951 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature,...

SENATOR CROSBY: He can ope...Senator Chambers, you're recognized to open on your amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. I had offered an amendment the other day to strike all of this that is identified as Section 6 in the committee amendments. That was rejected. What I am offering is not a reconsideration because we have amended that section and it is different from what it was the other day. So I'm going to proceed. What Section 6 deals with is the unholy agreement reached between the sheriff and Jesse James. When we're told that this is a compromise, we need to know who the parties are who reached the compromise. I would like to ask Senator Schellpeper a question, if he will answer.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schellpeper, is it true that this amendment represents a compromise?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes, it does.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schellpeper, you must have at least two parties to reach a compromise, is that true?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: That's right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: This is a compromise between whom and whom?
