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liquor licenses proliferate. So the liquor industry wants to say let the state enactment preempt the field and no locality can enact an ordinance stricter than what the state has put in place. They can lobby the Legislature more easily than they can try to lobby every city and every county, and they can bully the Legislature more easily. The Legislature is accustomed to being bullied by the big shots, and the hangover from having been bullied by somebody from the tobacco industry will probably carry right over to the liquor industry lobbyists coming and your head has been thumped and bloodied once and you don't want to get it thumped and bloodied again, so you say I'm not up to it, I will give them what they want. I'm not in favor of that. I've described what true compromising is, what negotiating may be. Each side gives a little, each side gains a little. They both give and they both receive, and neither winds up perhaps with exactly and precisely what he or she was seeking in the beginning. Senator Redfield, this will be the first time you've heard this example from me, but I've given it so much my colleagues could probably give it with me, except that they don't pay attention, so it will be new to some of them. You have six eggs, I have six eggs. We negotiate until I have 12 eggs and you have no eggs, and I say that was a successful negotiation. When you get some more eggs, come back and we'll negotiate some more. The liquor industry goes to Senator Schellpeper, they say, Senator Sheriff Schellpeper, these handcuffs are going to be too tight, those bars in that jail are going to be too thick, and they are too close together. So here's how we'll compromise with you. We don't want these handcuffs on, so let's compromise by you taking them off. He'll say, that's fair to me; click, click, the handcuffs come off. But they are still in the cell. They say now we're going to compromise on this jail cell. We're not going to ask you to make the bars thinner or weaker, we just want you to spread them farther apart. And Sheriff Schellpeper says, yeah, they're giving me something; I don't have to make the bars weaker, still got them big strong bars. Yeah, I'll spread them apart, and we spread them apart. Sheriff Schellpeper has negotiated and compromised and he goes home,...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...eats his supper and comes back, and the
