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the entire state. The General Affairs Committee is where this section, basically, came from. It didn't come from the retailers. This section here came from the General Affairs Committee after the testimony about...that we had last summer, last fall, and also with this bill that we have a lot of different sting operations out there and how it's being done, and we think we need to get one set of rules how they actually do this across the entire state. That's where this section came from. So I would urge the body this morning to not accept this amendment because this is the heart of what we're trying to get at to trying to make something that is really the same across the entire state. Senator Chambers' concerns have all been addressed. This is just another way to try to sidetrack the bill. This part needs to stay in there because in its present form it doesn't do what Senator Chambers wants and also it doesn't do what everybody's concern was the other day. In its present form now, it's a, I think, a very good part. It gets us to have a...when they do these here checks we'll have the report each year to know how they are operating statewide. Right now we don't. We only know certain areas. We need to know statewide, and they said they can do that, and I think that's very important. So, at this time, I'd urge the body not to accept the Chambers amendment to strike Section 6. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Schellpeper. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Madam President, members, I have my curiosity aroused a little bit, Senator Schellpeper. May I ask Senator Schellpeper a question.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Schellpeper, will you yield.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I support your committee amendments, I think, but I...do you have a copy of the guidelines, or a sample copy of what guidelines would be?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes, I do.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, I won't...I will look at them.
