much smoke that you had to have bright distinctively colored uniforms to know friend from foe. So what the British would do is walk in a straight line and the ones who were going to fire first would squat, kneel down, and the ones behind them would shoot. And the reason those in front knelt down was so they wouldn't be shot in the back of the head by those who were shooting. So if it was being run by the Legislature, what they would do is say this.
