SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...sack it in, and Procrustes would say, well, here's the bed, lay down, Jim; I'm using poor grammar. Jim would stretch out and he'd lay down, his head would hit the backboard, bam! His feet would be hanging over the bottom board. He'd say, Jim, we've got to correct that. So he'd tell him, we're going to slide you down so your head touches the backboard.
