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SENATOR CHAMBERS: And...and they catch a lot of these...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Oh, yeah, definitely.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...miscreants?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Definitely.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then why don't we say that we compared the number of stings conducted in Omaha, and say that the methodology used by the Omaha Police Division will become the standard for the state? Why don't we do it that way?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Because the State Patrol covers the entire state, Senator.
