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basis of putting into the bill ideas I believe in rather than the current process of taking ideas out that I don't believe in.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Landis. Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Thank you, Madam President and members. We checked with the Project Extra Mile, and they follow these exactly to a T right now, the ones that were passed out. Senator Chambers says that Omaha needs to be different. They follow all of these right now. So there's nothing different in there. All we're saying, let's put it into statute what will happen. These are just the commission's and with some guidance from the State Patrol. They...their view is that if they don't follow most of this here, it will be thrown out when they go through the court system. So, we're not changing anything, we're just saying that statewide it will be done the same way. Senator Landis is concerned with the committee amendments. There were several of those things that were taken out by amendment. The presumption was all...was all stricken, that isn't in there anymore. The committee amendments, I think, are a very good version of what we currently have. We...Senator Chambers had a lot of concerns with the first part about it, with the sting. We've taken care of all those concerns. There's nothing left in that Section 6, basically, except that there shall be guidelines that everybody is following right now. So I think the body needs to move forward. I know there's going to be more discussion. I have several amendments also I think that will help the bill as we get down farther in the actual bill. But I think we've spent enough time this morning on the committee amendments, and I would urge the body to eventually move on and adopt the committee amendments. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Schellpeper. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Madam President, members of the Legislature. Senator Schellpeper, I'd like to ask you a question.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Schellpeper, will you yield once more?
