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proper budgeting. Also, this last summer, when we were out traveling, we found out some...came across some situations of group homes that are opening up in many of our rural areas. No prewarning. Some situations from some schools...for some schools that could just have impacts that it would be almost impossible for them to deal with. They wouldn't even...they wouldn't have enough money in their reserves. It's one of those kind of crisis situations. And, of course, you heard very much about one particular school district that has a crisis situation that they've been talking to us a great deal about this year. Those things do happen. The other is sometimes, and I think last session and the session before we brought to you particular situations when there was a real error, by someone other than the schools, that caused a significant crisis situation, and those happened to be from assessors. Now, that's rather...that isn't frequent, but it does happen. And when it happens we need to have a way to react and to be able to set up something so that we can soften the blow and set up a payback schedule for them. And so that really, on the committee...the committee amendments, it was more altering the method by which a school would go about presenting their case. The commissioner has 30 days to notify the district of the decision after receiving the application. And the commissioner may award any amount he or she deems appropriate, with any amount repayment conditions consistent with the provisions of act. It also says the president of the school board of any district receiving funds pursuant to this measure shall sign an agreement stating that the costs are accurate, as can be determined at that point, the events are unexpected, and the district make any required repayments to the fund. That's very important. Even if a school would have a boiler go out, they may be getting the money back from their insurance, from errors and omission, but that first year they'd have a very difficult time. By having the president of the school boards sign this, would certainly guarantee that the...it is, indeed, a crisis situation, because if this was faulty that school district would stand to lose all of their state aid. And so I think we've put the precautions in there to very clearly react to those unique situations. And I hope that you will see fit, as a first step, to adopt the committee amendments. Thank you.
