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would like to examine or make sure I understand exactly what all is included. We've got an opportunity to withdraw money from this hardship fund, if there are one or more unexpected discrete occurrences. And these occurrences may include but are not limited to, so they could, as I understand it from the bill, be the opening of a group home, or an additional special education expenditure, or a clerical error. Now, those, as I understand it then, would be possibilities, but certainly not the universe in terms of what might qualify. There is an allocation mechanism in here which I would like to point out to you. You have to have an increase in your special education expenditures of 10 percent, or 3 times the cost group costing...cost grouping...cost per student for the standard cost grouping in a given fiscal year. This amounts to about \$13,000. And I'm probably repeating some of what Senator Bohlke said. So that if your special ed expenses were \$130,000 or more, then you would need a bigger than \$13,000 increase in order to qualify for this. If it was less than \$130,000, then a smaller increase would be...would qualify you. Senator Bohlke, could I ask you a question? Do you know about how many schools would have qualified for this type of a program in the past year?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: No, there...I can tell you the...what we brought to the floor with the clerical errors. And I can tell you of the situations when we've been out visiting with schools that have been brought to our attention. But I can't give you a total count.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay. So it would...it would not be...you wouldn't have information available right now that would...that would suggest to you that in a year that 500,000 or 1 million, or 2 million, or however amount of this money might be needed?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Well, and I'm not sure how much studying or anything we would ever do that would help, because it depends on the magnitude of the errors. A couple of years ago the magnitude of the error, in the Hastings area, was quite significant. We've had some other minor ones that have come to our attention. There's one this year with some smaller schools. But last year there was the one with Davenport, that you
