going to build back again or not. But there's another...there's several reasons for something like this. And I think it's a good plan to have money laying there so they can use it, if they have a hardship. And so I want to thank Senator Cudaback for giving me time and for bringing this as his priority bill. Thank you.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Senator Jones. If there are no further lights, Senator Bohlke, would you like to close?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Senator Raikes and I have had a discussion, looking at the possibility, and I think it's a good suggestion, that if you did happen to get all of the money back in one year, you would...it wouldn't be paying it back over three years, that we would tighten it up and say you would have to make that payment back in that one year. I don't have a problem with that. I think that, you know, fiscally is a good recommendation. And so we can work on that before we get to Select File. And so, with that, I don't have anything. It's a pretty straightforward bill. I am sorry Senator Coordsen isn't able to be here today to talk about some of the needs he's seen in this bill, but he had to travel home with a situation. So, I...this, I would hope that you would be able to recognize the need and support this, knowing that there would be an amendment that would tighten it up, coming on Select File. Thank you.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. You've heard the closing on the committee amendments. We'll now prepare to vote. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of committee amendments.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Committee amendments are adopted. We'll now have discussion on the main bill. Senator Bohlke, do you have any...you waive closing? Closing is waived. We'll now vote on the advancement of LB 314. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.
