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have to consent to the order. I mean this was...this was the way the business worked. And so people would make an order, an initial order, and then I'm sure lots of time they would like to change that, even though the cake mixes were very good. But this provides a cooling off period, a chance for the person to examine what they've done and see whether it's really what they should do, and I think that aspect of the bill is terribly positive. So, with that, I will say no more. I'll be glad to work with Senator Beutler, Senator Crosby or others on the amendment, if they wish, and thank you, Mr. Chairman.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Bromm. To speak to the Beutler amendment, Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I, too, am glad to hear Senator Bromm explain that part of the bill that does guarantee a refund of that...or a cancellation, that you can cancel that order by the fifth day. I also might add that in the Section B you have 30 days after the date in which the seller receives to return that merchandise also, so that...that would give you plenty of time too. And I don't know whether...whether that's necessary or not to have Senator Beutler's bill (sic), but it certainly wouldn't hurt anything and I'm sure Senator Crosby agrees with that, that the more protection you can have the better off you are. So if that...if that needs to be in the bill, I see no reason for not putting it in. But there are...there are plenty of catches the...in here to ward off any potentially dangerous transaction that an elderly person may encounter with the high-pressured use of some of the telemarketers. That's not all of them. We have a lot of good telemarketers in this state and in the country and (inaudible) you have to have bills like this to protect, to protect people and to protect ourselves from the, what do I want to call, the bad apples in the barrel. There are plenty of good apples, but there's always a few bad ones, so that's why we have to have legislation like this and I would support the committee amendments and Senator Beutler's amendment, if it needs to be. Thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Janssen. There are no other lights on. Senator Beutler, did you wish to close?
