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more changes than others, and that's the new Section 7 on page 2, and it runs through page 3. That language is word for word what the federal FCC has authorized with respect to payments from one company to another or payments from a company to a slam victim to put them back where they should be once you undo the slamming process. By reciting federal law, it seems to me that we're doing the practices that will become the rule around the country and which are the appropriate standards for the Public Service Commission to carry out. There is a recitation on page 4 in subsection (6) that the Public Service Commission may, from time to time, review and adjust the reimbursement procedures in a manner consistent with federal law. And those are the provisions, essentially, of the amendments to the committee amendments. They came to our attention after the committee had done its work. My guess is the committee would have accepted these and maybe had their own style of how they would have said them but they are not inconsistent with the bill and, as a matter of fact, you should have on your desk a letter from the Public Service Commission that says that they've reviewed AM0789 and...or its successor number, and the one that we're giving you is that successor, and that they find it consistent with the pending FCC rules. It provides the commission with the authority to enforce the provisions of those rules, and that the legislation, generally, is an excellent step towards protecting the Nebraska consumer, under the signature of Lowell Johnson, Chairman. I would ask for the adoption of the committee amendments. I think Senator Bromm has his light on to make crystal-clear what the legislative intent of this language is. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Landis. For discussion on the Landis amendment to the committee amendment, Senator Chris Peterson.

SENATOR CHRIS PETERSON: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I will just reiterate what Senator Landis said. This has been a working bill. When we started originally with 150, the FCC was in the process of reviewing the slamming provisions, and so as LB 150 went through, as well as Senator Landis's, there was some rules and orders that came out. The copy that you have before you, Senator Landis's amendment, does take into consideration the changes so that we are consistent with the FCC rules, and I
