without your authority, the authorized carrier must restore you back to the premium programs that you had before. An example of that would be something like frequent flier miles. If you were getting credit for those through your telephone calls, and now you've been slammed, you will get the credit back for those premium calls. The administrative penalty that the Public Service Commission has now by statute been given; again that would allow them to fine for each violation up to \$2,000, and then enlisted in the committee amendment, it explains what those violations would be based on. It does not say "shall". Again, that gives the flexibility to the Public Service Commission. They may impose the fine if they wish to but this will give them the flexibility that if they do not have to have the hearing after they go into the investigation, they would have the flexibility as opposed to "shall". I think that those were the ones that I wanted to clarify, and I'd be glad to turn my time now over to Senator Bromm.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Senator Bromm, would you like to be recognized? You have about forty-five seconds left on Senator Peterson's time.
