section of the amendment, the increase of the 50,000 or the...50,000 limitation to 60,000 on the value of the home really goes to those who are already eligible. It really doesn't bring any more people into the system. And the same thing, to an extent, is true with the increase on the upper limit of the home for going from 95 thousand dollars to 125, or their percentage of the county average housing value. That brings...that one brings in some people who otherwise would be eligible who have been shut out because of the valuation of their property. So it will bring...also bring new people who are qualified by income, not qualified by valuation, for any type of a reduction into the system. You add all of that together plus it also includes some new eligibility standards, the cost of what we've done so far is probably something less than the 3 to 3.5 million dollars because of that being factored on those portions that are left in the amendment that current exist. So if this isn't passed, the cost of the other will be something less. I don't know what it will be, but it will be something less than if the whole package was passed simply because of eligibility. Boy, that is clear as mud, isn't it, Nancy? (Laugh) But that is how it works. Everything interrelates with one another. We have made a major step increasing the percentage of taxes for those who...or will be eligible for 100 percent and added a few more people into the system for 25 percent if we stop now.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: One minute.

SENATOR COORDSEN: And if we go on, and I'm going to vote to go on, but nonetheless it does both increase the numbers and the amount of the dollar eligibility of individuals within the system. I think it's probably the right thing to do, but I wish I hadn't a gotten up and started talking about that. Thank you, Mr. President. (Laughter)
