And I think the amendment, if you look at it, gives the Workers' Compensation Court, at least in my mind, this three-judge panel, the judge...the role of not only judge but also as fact finder, which would be left to the executive branch, and also jury and executioner. And so, for that reason, I did ask for an Attorney General's Opinion. I just wanted to let the body know and also Senator Landis that I had done that.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Quandahl. Further discussion on the Landis amendment. Senator Landis, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you. I think we can only be illuminated by what the Attorney General has to say. Whether or not we think that he is an authoritative source for the law is apparently some question in the body, but it's most appropriate to do so and I welcome the request for an Attorney General's by Senator Quandahl. I would, at this moment, however, ask for the adoption of the amendment and allow the process to go forward and for us to take a vote today. Thank you.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Landis. The question before us is the adoption of Amendment 725 to LB 331. Those in favor vote aye; those opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Landis's amendment.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: The amendment is agreed to. Senator Cudaback would like to announce the following guests are visiting the Legislature: 40 fourth graders from the Pershing Elementary School in Lexington along with their teachers. (Introduced teachers.) They are located in the north balcony. If you'd rise we'd, please, like to recognize you and welcome you to the Nebraska Legislature. The next item on the agenda would be an amendment by Senator Landis, Amendment 833 to LB 331. Senator Landis, you're recognized to open. (See page 1040 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Lieutenant Governor Maurstad. One of the people that we worked with in the process of working the bill out and solving what controversies there were was Jeff
