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of the contacts that I've had with people who have been caught in this box. The question is, more importantly, a realistic assessment of the amount of money that is available within the noncustodial parent's income to have shared,...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR COORDSEN: ...by court order, with their children, which is their responsibility to do. We had a letter from somebody in Omaha that had a most, almost obscene example of how self-employed people could get away from paying any child support. That's not the issue. The issue is that the courts should consider this in the determination of income for the purpose of doing child support calculations and that...those are done and redone and recalculated on a regular basis as changes in circumstances come about. This is a part of that picture that should be done. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Senator Kristensen.

SPEAKER KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Madam President. Members of the Legislature, I rise to support the bracket motion. I did have an amendment up that would have delayed the implementation of this. Quite frankly, given the fact that Senator Crosby's bill is going to pass, I don't think there's any doubt about that. I'm willing to examine the area of child support guidelines. I'm extremely unwilling to begin to take one piece out of the puzzle of child support guidelines, and that would be Senator Baker's bill, and I...Senator Baker knows that this is certainly not a personal issue. I understand his concern for what appears to be some inequities in the child support system, but I'll tell you there are a variety of those inequities out there that are...that...and if you do this piece, I'll guarantee you there's going to be other bills in there and, thus, Senator Crosby's bill becomes very reasonable. I know Senator Crosby finds that hard to believe, but it...it does become very reasonable to look at the big picture. And the bottom line is you either have the courts decide what child support is, or the Legislature ought to decide. But if you're going to mix and match you're going to have the two sides warring and ultimately, ultimately, whether you like it or not, it is an order of the
