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these guidelines and there are about...there's about 2 sentences that deal with the issue that Senator Baker's bill addresses. The rest of the guidelines deal with many other issues which are terribly important to the process of setting child support, and that's why I want to emphasize that to pick one factor and make a judgment on that is extremely dangerous. These things all fit together. Now they...they need to be revisited. Times change. The factors should be looked at, but how should they be looked at? LB 407, Senator Crosby's bill, is on Final Reading. Let me say that one more time. It is on Final Reading. It makes no sense to do LB 612 if we're going to pass LB 407, unless we're going to put in place a process of two professionals who work in the field of economics or mathematics, two judges whose jurisdiction includes domestic relations, two members of the Bar Association who practice domestic relations, two members of the Legislature, a custodial parent and a noncustodial parent, and then tell them we want you to take this factor that we've put into statute and work that into your recommendations with respect to how child support should be established. We have very qualified, a well-rounded suggested group of people called the Child Support Commission that will be adopted if we pass LB 407 when it comes up for vote in a matter of, I assume, of a very few days here. And that is why I did not put a kill motion on Senator Baker's bill. I do not want the issue that Senator Baker is raising to be simply shoved under the carpet. I want his bill to be there next January if we need it, or I suppose if this...I will do this. If LB 407 does not pass and we're still in session, well, we would be, I will do a...I will do an "unbracket" motion, Senator Baker, to unbracket your bill and bring it back before the body, and that's how much...I mean, I respect the issue and I respect what you're trying to do. I just don't think it's the right thing to do right now with the prospect of (LB) 407. Thank you very much.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Before continuing the discussion, Senator Jim Jensen has, as his guest and under the north balcony, Suheil Saoud, a Presbyterian minister from Beirut. Dr. Saoud, would you please stand and be welcomed by the Nebraska Legislature. Thank you for being here. Continuing the discussion on the bracket motion, Senator Chambers.
