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part of a judge. So it goes back to me to let's address the issue now. This study might be fine and I will support that... I think I will support that study. It looks like there's an A bill with it, number one, there will be an A bill with it. It goes on, there's no sunset on it, so really I don't know that we may need it if we can address the one concern that apparently people in state of Nebraska have with current child support guidelines that are really discriminatory, and that's being depreciation. Maybe this bill, if we pass it, we don't need another study committee and so on. All those people are fine and dandy and it looks like a great group of people could be assembled. But, for the life of me, all the people who have contacted me on 612, all they've been concerned with is the depreciation, not all these other factors. and so I guess I won't make a blanket statement that, yes, I'll support (LB) 407 if we get 612 passed, I really don't think we need a (LB) 407, unless we want to look at amending the bill to where we simply take the function clear, the responsibility away from the State Supreme Court. Maybe we ought to just get it clear out of there. They...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR BAKER: ...I'm going to have to go back and look at the transcript, but I believe he said we don't...we aren't interested in it. Most people on the street have no idea who sets child support guidelines anyway and, as a couple attorneys in western Nebraska told me, and they've had the same story so they're in collusion or something, but said an economist at the University Colorado basically drafted these guidelines, and I do see that they've been...been amended over the years, a piece here and a piece there, but we have a need here and here's the solution. So, with that, I will yield the rest of my time back to the Chair and oppose the motion to bracket and go ahead and get on with it. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Baker. Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Madam President, members of the body. I also support your bill, Senator Crosby, in case you were wondering. One of the things that has interested me about this, and it's not directly involved in 612, but some of the
