SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR COORDSEN: ...word to discover the...to describe the attitude that those questions about who was paying and who wasn't paying received; that noncustodial parents are viewed by the judicial system in Nebraska as the enemy of their own children, and that is an attitude that we're partially trying to address.
