designated in some of the dormitories and they are working to reduce the numbers and sizes of those, but we have made accommodation for those as well. I think we have addressed the concerns that Senator Janssen raised with the dormitories. Senator Chris Peterson had raised the concerns with the veterans homes. We have addressed that. It was Senator Bohlke's concern regarding the designation at the state parks so that, as currently they do not have any designation, you can smoke in any of the cabins or not smoke, this would designate some as being smoking, some as not smoking, and designate a percentage in breaking that down. We do not have in this amendment the ban of ten feet in front of any building, so that which was a concern at the last discussion has now been not included in this amendment. The other issue that was raised, as I was told in the last discussion, was the issue of vehicles and, as a most recent assessment, the Department of Administrative Services currently has a policy banning smoking in all Department of Administrative vehicles excluding specialty vehicles. So we checked to see what the specialty vehicles were and what the policy was there. Specialty vehicles are Health and Human Service vehicles, such as those that transport handicapped or other people. Obviously, you would expect Health and Human Services to have a ban on all of their vehicles and, appropriately, they do. So all of their specialty vehicles also are not allowed to have smoking inside. Another specialty vehicle is our Military Department. Understandably, those are specialty vehicles. The Military Department has banned smoking in all of their vehicles since 1992, so those specialty vehicles are also not allowed to have smoking in them. Game and Parks has some specialty vehicles, so we checked with Game and Parks. Game and Parks also bans smoking in all of their vehicles, all of them, period. Department of Roads is the other agency that has specialty vehicles. Department of Roads has also banned smoking in all of their specialty vehicles. So, in effect, we have no vehicles in the state where smoking is currently allowed so, to my knowledge, what we're doing here it not doing anything beyond what's already being done. Smoking is already banned in all of the vehicles. I think at this point we have addressed all of the concerns that people have raised to the degree that we're able to accommodate and to do that. Have we addressed it to the concern that people are simply philosophically opposed to the concept? I would say no. There are still certainly some
