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SENATOR HARTNETT: I'm just, you know, just...

SENATOR BROMM: Sure. I think they would be bound to follow the...

SENATOR HARTNETT: Statute?

SENATOR BROMM: ...the state law if they're going to do business here.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay. Yeah, I think what you're doing is very good practice to put in the state law, but I just, as I was listening to you, I just...that question rose in my mind.

SENATOR BROMM: Sure.

PRESIDENT MAURSTAD: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Further discussion on Amendment 413. Senator Bromm, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR BROMM: Well, thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, and those were some good questions. I particularly...I am cognizant of Senator Beutler's point that if we have consent calendar this very well might be a consent calendar bill. As we know, we didn't have it last year, we haven't had it so far this year, I don't know when we're going to have it and this bill seems to be very germane to Senator Dwite Pedersen's 632. So I just think it fits and so I would like to see if we can attach it to 632. And I think it is a worthy subject. We do want to maintain our dealerships in Nebraska to the extent that we can and this will just help them in some respect to be able to offer a little bit...a little bit more variety of automobiles like their competitors do, hopefully. Secondly, there is...in response to Senator Hartnett's question just a little bit further, there is an opportunity on the part of the board which governs motor vehicles and dealerships to take action if a manufacturer doesn't comply with the law, which could include a significant fine, and I assume that they would have the ability to take other action in terms of injunctive action as well, damages and that kind of thing. So, with that, I would ask the body to support Amendment 413.
