SENATOR SMITH: Mr. President, I'd move the advancement of LB 574 to E & R for engrossing.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The motion is to advance LB 574 to E & R for engrossing. Those in favor please say aye. Those opposed nay. The bill is advanced. Items for the record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, a communication from the Governor. (Read. Re: LB 149. See pages 1067-1068 of the Legislative Journal.) Mr. President, pursuant to receipt of that message, Senator Bohlike would move that LB 149 become law notwithstanding the objection of the Governor. Agriculture Committee reports LB 835 to General File with committee amendments attached, Mr. President. That's all that I have at this time. (See pages 1068-1073 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Before we proceed, I should like to announce that I have as my guest in the north balcony 45 fourth through the sixth grade students from Chester-Hubbell-Byron Schools, Chester, Nebraska. Their teachers, Judy Kuhlmann, Cari Mestl, and Myrna Brauch, both a friend and neighbor of mine. So would you please rise and let us welcome you to the Chamber. Good morning. It's good to have you here. That concluded Select File. Moving on to General File, next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 674 introduced by Senator Wickersham. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 20, referred to the Retirement Systems Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending, Mr. President. (See AM0733 referred to on page 942 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Wickersham, to open on your bill.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. LB 674 is a bill that does two things in the school employees retirement plan. Now I want you to be aware that when I speak of the school employees retirement plan, I am not talking about OPS. That is in a separate system. This concerns all of the school employees other than those employed by OPS.
